Frances Allen Rapin, 1920-2024

Frances remained an active volunteer until almost the age of 100, coming in to help with various tasks in the back room every week. During her time as President, she was the spark behind the creation of our Serendipity Book Store (see Serendipity elsewhere in this newsletter.) Over the course of her service she was honored by the Humboldt Library Foundation with its Helen Everett Award and also by FRL with our Community Service Award, which now bears her name. Her many contributions to the Friends over the years will be remembered with gratitude.

FRL Membership Matters

Head's up! Beginning in September, we're implementing a \$5.00 surcharge for individual and family members that receive printed newsletters. As individual and family members renew, the surcharge will be assessed for printed newsletters.

The FRL Board evaluated the cost of printing and mailing newsletters and found that they cost more than \$10.00/yr. per person. Since individual membership is just \$5.00/yr and family membership is \$8.00/yr., this means funds raised through higher price point membership fees and book sales are being diverted from supporting the library to paying for the newsletter.

The board considered whether to raise the membership fees or to add a surcharge for printed newsletters. We want to make sure as many people as possible can continue to be members at a price point that fits their budgets. While we cannot justify spending more on delivery of newsletters than we receive from the member in membership fees, a substantial number of members receive their newsletters by email. We will be shifting all members who provide email addresses to emailed newsletters. Those who wish to continue to receive printed newsletters should notify us when they renew.

I look forward to seeing you at the membership table at the next book sale.
