### FRL, 1966-2016

### Years of Advocacy and Service by Stephanie Hillman

When plans were announced in 1971 for the first Humboldt County Children's Author Festival, the Friends stepped up immediately to offer both moral and financial support. This action resulted in our becoming one of the official sponsors of a biennial event that has become an institution on the North Coast. Many members of the Friends regularly serve as driver-hosts for visiting authors and participate in various other activities and we provide annual support of \$1,500 as well as serving as the umbrella organization for tax reporting purposes.

In July 1978 the reality of Proposition 13 became apparent with news that the related budget cuts and changes to the method of funding library services would result in the elimination of Monday service at all branches and a significant reduction in hours of service and the laying off of a third of the staff. The Library's budget had, in fact, been cut by 80 percent. The Friends immediately went into action and, with the support of the Humboldt County Board of Education, asked the Board of Supervisors for bail-out money. Their request was eventually forwarded to state legislators for action.

Over the years the Friends had become well know for the book sales through which they raised money for the Library system but their aims went far beyond that. As early as 1972 they began advocating for the building of a new library and, when a decision was finally made and a prospective site chosen in 1985, they were ready to start serious fundraising. Book sales were earmarked specifically to raise money for the building fund and funds were also raised from many other sources. Over the years, the Friends contributed over \$30,000 to the fund, including \$10,000 specifically for furniture and equipment. Some members of the Friends were also active on the Library Construction Advisory committee, which was responsible for bringing the new library into being at its present site through years of naysayers, budget problems, and lawsuits. When the brand new library finally opened on November 4, 1995, hundreds of people shared in the sense of accomplishment.

But there were problems around the corner and, once again, the Friends of the Redwood Libraries would step up in a big way. Watch for more in our next issue.

### GIFTS TO THE LIBRARY, 2015-16

During the fiscal year that ended on June 30 the Friends provided a total of \$29,856 to the Library for a variety of purposes, as follows:

•	For online support for the Library's cataloging operations	642

•	For bindery expenses	1,500
•	For hospitality at professional meetings	259
•	For catering at the Library's 20th anniversary celebration	438
•	For the Summer Reading Program	630

In addition to funding provided directly to the Library, the Friends also made our annual gift of \$1,500 to the Humboldt County Children's Author Festival. Both the Library and the Friends are sponsors of this biennial event.

All gifts made by the Friends are funded from sales in our Serendipity Book Store, on the internet and at quarterly book sales, as well as from the sale of the Children's Art Calendar and of Liberry Preserves. Funds also come from donations, including memorial donations, Community Service Awards, and membership dues beyond the basic level. We are grateful to all of our Friends and supporters whose generosity makes it possible for us to continue to provide gifts such as these.
